

# 2016 American Family Rodeo Association

## Queen Application and Rules

1. All Contestants must be a member of the AFRA.
2. Contestants must sign a Waiver of Liability, the Expectation Statement, complete the contest application, and submit the required documents.
3. Contestants are required to provide their own wardrobes, and transportation to and from the contest and all promotional activities.
4. Coaching from the sidelines is not acceptable, can lead to disqualification.
5. Final decision in all categories will be that of the judges.
6. Pictures taken of the contestants by AFRA photographers during the contest become the property of the Queen Committee and may be used for publicity. Copies may be made available to contestants.
7. Video or pictures may be taken by parents, friends, or relatives of the contestants during the contest.
8. Contestants are not permitted at any time during the contest (as the reigning queen court or as a representative for the American Family Rodeo Association) to drink alcoholic beverages, use drugs, tobacco products, or use foul language in public.
9. All contestants must be aware of and conform to all AFRA dress codes (long sleeves western shirt, jeans, and western hat, boots and belt.)
10. All contestants and winners of the contest are required to dress western when representing the American Family Rodeo Association.
11. Any problems which arise should quickly be directed to any member of the Queen Committee.
12. After the coronation, each contestant is expected to stay and behave appropriately as well as show good sportsmanship. Misconduct could cause ineligibility for future contests. This will be decided by the Queen Committee.
13. There are three levels of eligibility for the Queen Contest.

Princess-9 & Under

Junior Queen-10—19 years old

AFRA Queen—19 & Under (All contestants are eligible and considered for this role.

Top contender overall will receive this honor)

## **CONTEST DIVISION**

- 1. APPEARANCE-**The purpose of this judging is to select the contestant is highest in:
  - Grooming-this should include neatness and cleanliness in every detail such as hat, boots, and other apparel
  - Posture
  - Professional behavior in every situation
  - Contestant's wardrobe
- 2. HORSEMANSHIP-**The purpose of this judging is to select the contestant is highest in:
  - Horsemanship-Control of mount and the way each situation is handled.
  - Balance-The ability to sit in a saddle.
  - Position of hands and feet.
  - Mounting and dismounting.
  - The understanding and skill of the contestant will be judged, and the overall appearance (grooming and cleanliness) of the horse and equipment.
  - Each contestant will be interviewed.
  - The contestant will be required to mount and dismount and perform a queen's presentation ride.
  - Dress wear for horsemanship is: Western jeans or pants and western cut blouse or shirt with long sleeves with shirttail tucked in. Hat, boots and belts are required.
  - Since a contestant's personality projects from horseback to the audience and judges, showmanship should be considered.
  - Excessive use of spurs will not be permitted.
  - Hats must be secured to ensure that they do not come off while performing.
- 3. POISE AND PERSONALITY-**The purpose of this division is to select the contestant who rates highest in:
  - Intelligence-Good common sense and logic.

## ***CONTEST DIVISION (cont.)***

- Education-Good grammar and general education.
  - Conversational ability in varied areas.
  - Sense of humor.
  - Genuine interest in other people, noticeable consideration of others, and good sportsmanship at all times.
  - Projection-Ability to project one's personality whether from horseback in an arena, or before an audience.
  - Showmanship-Being able to present oneself in a gracious manner.
  - Happy outlook on life in general.
  - Ability to keep composure in public.
2. **PERSONAL INTERVIEW**-Each contestant will be asked several general 'impromptu' questions about herself during the Personal Interview. The judges will score each contestant according to how well she presents herself, her composure and mannerisms while answering the questions. This will be added to her final scoring.
3. **RIDING PATTERN** The purpose of this judging is to select the contestant highest in handling a horse and the queens responsibilities in the arena.
- Enter the arena at a walk going to the right. Pick up your left lead to start your queen's wave. Go around the arena one full time at a controlled fast pace presenting your wave.
  - Come to a stop at the point you started your queen's wave.
  - Pick up the flag at the gate. Walk to 1st cone with Flag. Trot to 2nd Cone with Flag. Lope 1 lap of the arena from the gate. Bring your horse to the middle of the arena facing the crowd at a stop.
  - Walk your horse over to the judges, dismount, answer the judge's questions, and remount.
  - Once you have mounted, take the flag back to the gate and exit the arena.

# **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

This statement represents an agreement, a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), between the American Family Rodeo Association, hereinafter referred to as "AFRA" and \_\_\_\_\_, a 2016 AFRA Queen contestant.

The purpose of this MOU is to confirm the contestant's understanding of the expectations set forth by the AFRA Queen Committee regarding the competition for the AFRA Queen. It discloses the expectations of the AFRA Queen and contestants vying for the title. I understand that by competing in the AFRA Queen Contest, or by winning the AFRA Queen, I will be representing the AFRA.

Furthermore, I will be responsible for promoting the sport of rodeo in its true light to the general public. I further understand that should I not be chosen as the 2016 AFRA Queen, I may be asked to represent the AFRA in the event that the chosen Queen is unable to appear at any of the various events. I agree that I will eagerly and enthusiastically participate in activities when invited, including riding in the Grand Entries during the upcoming Rodeos.

At all times I will strive to portray unexcelled sportsmanship, high morals, ethical character, and humane treatment to animals. As AFRA's representatives, I will act, speak, and dress according to the esteem my title deserves any time I am in the public eye. If I am chosen AFRA Queen, I agree to the following Articles:

## ARTICLE

- I. I will appear at events to promote the American Family Rodeo Association my entire reign.
- II. I will wear my banner, crown, and proper western attire whenever I make an appearance as the AFRA Queen or for portrait photos for the use of promoting the American Family Rodeo Association.
- III. I will comply with this MOU and keep in close contact with the chairperson of the Queen Committee. It is my responsibility to notify the chairperson if: any problems arise, or if I am unable to make any appearances as scheduled. Should I be unable to make any event, I will notify the chairperson seven days in advance.
- IV. I will encourage others to participate in future contest, act as hostess to contestants in future contests, and assist in the promotion of the contest in any way possible.
- V. I understand that all of my appearances must have AFRA approval.
- VI. I understand that I would have to forfeit all prizes if I act in a manner that does not adhere to this MOU. If there are negative reports on my conduct, the Queen Committee chairperson will discuss the matter with me. If there is no resolution to the problem, AFRA can request that I relinquish my title along with prizes.
- VII. Finally, I completely understand that the AFRA Queen Contest is a competition that recognizes a number of attributes: Horsemanship, appearance, personality, knowledge of Rodeo.

During the contest, I will exhibit the utmost sportsmanship and conduct myself in a professional matter.
